From the Pastor's Desk

It's rare that there are enough years in a lifetime for a pastor of a church to have the privilege to celebrate a centennial and a sesquicentennial of a congregation. Usually, those happen at minimum once in a century!

Because of the unique history of the Federated Church of Columbus, I had the privilege of celebrating with you all the 100th anniversary of the congregation (the centennial in 2014). This year, we have the privilege to celebrate the 150th (sesquicentennial) of the founding of the Congregational Church of Columbus. Everyone is warmly welcome to the 150th celebrate on Sunday, October 16th in the 9:30a.m. worship service. We will also recognize that day the folks who have been members of Federated for 50 + years.

Several folks have asked if this year's 150th celebration would include St. Luke's United Church of Christ here in Columbus. To answer this question, I took the opportunity to learn more about the history of St. Luke's.

St. Luke's was founded in 1872 by German-speaking Swiss families as St. Luke's German Reformed Church (six years after the Congregational Church's founding). In 1947, St. Luke's joined the Evangelical and Reformed ("E&R") denomination. (This info and more of the congregation's history can be found at St. Luke's website: http://

The Congregational Church of Columbus (founded in 1866) was the church that federated with the Columbus Presbyterian Church in 1914.

It was the formation of the United Church of Christ ("UCC") in 1957 that brought together America's Evangelical & Reformed ("E&R") churches and Congregational churches, creating the "UCC" denomination that St. Luke's and Federated now have in common.

So, because our two churches have two distinct founding churches, St. Luke's is not a part of this year's celebration at Federated – however – perhaps in 2017, Federated and St. Luke's could celebrate together the 60th anniversary of the birth of the United Church of Christ ("UCC").

One more note about St. Luke's: as many of you have heard, the pastor of St. Luke's, Rev. Chris McArdle, has accepted the call to be pastor of First Congregational Church in Anoka, Minnesota. Chris and his wife, Erin, warmly welcomed me to Columbus and we have had a very collegial relationship. Erin has collaborated with many Federated folks in hosting Mothers of Preschoolers (MOPS). I know you join me in thanking Chris and Erin for their positive presence in our communities and our sister churches!
